The Everyday Carry (EDC) Pen

The EDC Pen Range combines British design and German engineering with high-quality Chinese manufacturing and a lean, streamlined global operation to create this superb and stylish luxury pen at an affordable price point. Our first pen family – the Classic range – has been an Amazon best seller since launch in 2019. We incorporated our customer feedback and suggestions, our more than 25,000 Amazon reviews (at a 4.7 average) and research into existing EDC and pocket pens into the design process, ensuring that our new range would exceed the expectations of our customer base.




The Design Brief

Our customers wanted a smaller, everyday carry pen that was easy to slip into a trouser pocket. But writing comfort and aesthetics should not be sacrificed. Research into existing pocket pens showed that there were 3 main complaints against such pens:

- 1. Their diminutive size meant the pens could only accommodate non-standard micro converters or small cartridges, thus limiting the amount of ink that could be carried;
- 2. The caps would not post securely, making them prone to coming off. The cap on a pocket pen is designed to be attached to the back of the pen, extending it for comfortable writing;
- 3. The design of the pocket pen caps often resulted in the nibs leaking or the ink drying out when carried or in storage.

We wanted our design to combine a sense of the organic with precision engineering. As lovers of bamboo, we asked our team to incorporate subtle bamboo elements into the design.





The EDC Design Solution

The key features of this new product are our innovative cap design, together with the barrel of the pen which has threads at each end.

We worked with our team to perfect a cap design that securely holds the fountain pen nib very high in the cap, allowing the pen to be 20mm shorter than conventional pens.

This cap design has allowed for the shortest possible length of closed pen while still accommodating a full-size international standard converter or cartridge.

The fact that the cap screws onto the back of the pen means that there is no risk of the cap coming off in use, eliminating the second identified concern.

Once securely screwed shut, the internal design of the cap creates an airtight seal, ensuring the nib remains protected at all times, preventing ink from leaking or from drying out prematurely, eliminating the third concern.

In use, the cap is screwed on to the opposite end (posted), becoming an integral part of the body, and extending it into a fully-functioning full-size pen. At 140mm length, it provides a smooth, ergonomic and comfortable writing experience.

The secure screw fitting ensures that the cap stays securely in place while writing. The design of the cap has been developed to give the pen perfect balance when posted. Also, the design of the threads allows the clip on the cap to align with the nib, creating a much more aesthetically pleasing product.


The clip of the pen is designed to suggest the striations of a bamboo leaf. The barrel of the pen, with threads at each end, is designed to evoke the segmentation of a bamboo stem.



The diminutive length of the pen makes it far easier to carry in a small pocket. Our customers regularly tell us they put it in their trouser pocket and completely forget they are carrying it!




The EDC Pen Cap Design



The threaded barrel design allows the cap to be securely screwed on both ends, keeping it airtight when the cap is closed and transforming it into a fully-functioning pen when attached to the opposite end.




The EDC Pen Innovative Cap Design



The cap is specially engineered to hold and protect the nib higher up inside than standard lids, allowing for a much shorter pen length when closed. As can be seen, it is not possible for the pen to be any shorter given a key design was to accommodate a standard-size converter.

Function, Form & Fit



The comparison above shows our EDC pen versus our original 'Classic' pen range. The ultra-portable nature of the EDC pen is immediately apparent. The cap is detached and

screwed on the opposite end to convert it from its compact form to a full-size writing instrument. The posted cap is secure and will not come off during use.



Style & Finish



We offer a range of finishes and colours to appeal to the discerning tastes of consumers attracted to 'affordable luxury' items.

At Scriveiner, we subscribe to an ethos of 'luxury minimalism':
